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R U L E S A N D P E N A L T I E S

All competitors must report to the Officer in Charge of the competition five minutes before the scheduled time for commencement of the event in which they are taking part. Competitors will be allowed three minutes in which to arrange their equipment before commencement of a Drill.

R U L E S

1. Competitors must not be assisted by non-competitors during the competition
2. Dress to be Fire Helmet, Fire Tunic, Leather Belt and Pouch, Axe Leggings and Fire Boots (Leather or Rubber)
3. Hose to be 75 feet $2\frac{3}{4}$ " lines, and type "A" light alloy branchpipes, with appropriate nozzles.
4. Each competitor may roll the hose he will be using.
5. Appliances to be positioned and equipment stowed or placed as in accordance with each separate drill detail.
6. Suction hose will not be roped.
7. If considered necessary by the judges, the area around the dam may be soaked with water prior to the commencement of drill so that first crews have no advantage.
8. The signal for the commencement and termination of each drill will be given by the blowing of a whistle.
9. When the targets are knocked down, a whistle will be blown. At this signal, pump operators will close throttle and switch off engine. All competitors must then remain stationary until the judges make their examination.
